## CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT(CPD)

The Pharmacy and Poisons Board (PPB), established under the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, cap 244 Laws of Kenya is mandated to regulate the profession of pharmacy. In order to ensure fitness to practice is maintained and in line with the constitutional right to the highest attainable standard of health, all pharmacists and pharmaceutical technologists are required to undertake annual CPD as a condition for licensing, in accordance with sections 9A to 9F of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act.

The PPB notifies all interested parties as follows:

- The number of Continuing Professional Development (CPD) points required for renewal of 2020 practice licenses has been reduced from 40 points to 20 points.
- 2. Institutions, organizations or individuals who are eligible to be recognized as CPD providers in Kenya are invited to submit their online applications together with supporting documents for evaluation. A non-refundable application fee of Kshs. 2,000 will be payable upon submission of the applications. Only successful applicants will pay the prescribed provider accreditation fees. - Approved CPD providers are urged to develop content to support the national aspirations of Universal Health Coverage. For the greater reach, those who provide online CPD activities are encouraged to apply.
